God gave the apostles to the early church to guard, preserve, and transmit the message of Christ's redemption (Matt. 10:20, Mark 3:14-15, John. 20:21, Eph. 2:20-21). It seems clear that early Christians recognized the authority of the office of apostle and received the words of Paul and the others as authoritative eyewitnesses of Christ (1 Cor. 15:3-11, 1 Pet. 1:16-18). This is an important aspect of how the Bible gets to us today because it recognizes that there is a supernatural work happening beyond the human work of men writing gospel accounts or letters to churches.
