-----WORTH NOTING -----

Scripture tells us that we cannot fully understand God (Ps. 145:3, Job 26:14, Rom. 11:33-34). But Scripture also tells us that God is knowable (Jer. 9:23-24, John 14:8-11, John 17:3, 1 Cor. 2:12, 1 John 2:13). Despite being far above and beyond our finite human minds, God's character, ways, and will are revealed to us legitimately in Scripture so that we can say truly that we do know God. Also, there is a personal aspect to knowing God that comes by the experience of living upon what He has proclaimed and promised.
